



230 today: Forgotten painter of nudes who helped save York's medieval walls

HIS STATUE has stood in York for more than a century, watching over the historic architecture he fought to protect. Few passing it today will know that this would have been his 230th birthday.

The artist William Etty, largely forgotten now, was known in his time for his paintings of nudes. His works are exhibited across Britain.

Though he moved to London, he never lost his love for York, and when Victorian politicians clamoured to demolish the city's medieval Bar Walls, it was Etty who campaigned to save them.

The city's Lord Mayor, the "railway king", George Hudson, led the movement to tear down the walls, lest they stand in the way of progress.

MONK BAR

Monk Bar is one of four major fortified gateways on York's city walls. It was built in several stages, beginning in the early 14th century, when the threat from a hostile Scotland was particularly great. Its top storey was added in 1484 during the reign of Richard III.

When first built, Monk Bar had state-of-the-art defensive features. It had a gated barbican, a roofless walled enclosure to guard the approach to the main gateway. The main gateway itself contained a portcullis, which remains in place to this day, along with the machinery needed to operate it. A series of 'murder holes' overhead allowed missiles to be dropped onto any attackers drawing too close.

There are projecting 'bartizan' towers at each of the bar's front two corners. These are crenellated, as is an outer gallery at third-floor level. These features, together with gunports and many arrow slits, were designed to allow the bar's defenders to engage attackers with projectile weapons. In the event of attackers breaking into the bar, they would have found each floor individually defensible: the staircase is not continuous, so they would have had to cross each quard room to reach the

As well as being part of the city's defences, Monk Bar has also been used as a temporary prison and a police house. It retains two of its medieval toilets (known as 'garderobes'). The figures on top of the bar represent men hurling boulders.





IN that part of the city of York which is situated on the western bank of the Ouse there is a narrow street, called Skeldergate, running nearly north and south, parallel with the course of the river. The postern by which Skeldergate was formerly approached no longer exists; and the few old houses left in the street are disguised in melancholy modern costume of whitewash and cement. Shops of the smaller and poorer order, intermixed here and there with dingy warehouses and joyless private residences of red brick, compose the present aspect of Skeldergate. On the river-side the houses are separated at intervals by lanes running down to the water, and disclosing lonely little plots of open ground, with the masts of sailing-barges rising beyond. At its southward extremity the street ceases on a sudden, and the broad flow

of the Ouse, the trees, the meadows, the public-walk on one bank and the towing-path on the other, open to view.

Here, where the street ends, and on the side of it furthest from the river, a narrow little lane leads up to the paved footway surmounting the ancient Walls of York. The one small row of buildings, which is all that the lane possesses, is composed of cheap lodging-houses, with an opposite view, at the distance of a few feet, of a portion of the massive city wall. This place is called Rosemary Lane. Very little light enters it; very few people live in it; the floating population of Skeldergate passes it by; and visitors to the Walk on the Walls, who use it as the way up or the way down, get out of the dreary little passage as fast as they can.






