





Friends of York Walls secures National Lottery support for festival

The Friends of York Walls have received a National Lottery Heritage Fund grant of £10,000 to share the heritage of York Walls this year. The money will be used to run an enhanced version of the York Walls Festival, this year on 10th/11th August, and also fund the creation of a family and a school pack about the walls, create a dedicated website for the Festival, improve visitor information and displays, and provide a programme of expert talks and volunteer training leading up to and following on from the Festival itself.

Supported through the National Lottery Heritage Fund, the project will enable local people and visitors to York to discover more about the history of the Walls. They will have the opportunity to walk the Walls with well-informed guides, or to walk round under their own steam but have the experience enhanced through information packs. There will also be a series of heritage-related talks in the run-up to York Walls Festival.

Various landmarks around the Walls will be given additional prominence during the Festival, for example, Fishergate Postern Tower will have a display of the findings of the archaeological dig which took place under its floor just before Christmas as part of bringing electricity into the building. Also Baile Hill, a less well-known feature of the walls, will be the focus of new visitor information and its neighbouring wall features highlighted. There will also be community benefits in the form of enhanced events during the Festival, for example a community food event at the Red Tower on the Saturday.

There will be activity packs for schools, and interested members of the public will be able to attend workshops on searching archives, understanding the technical properties of the stone used for the walls, and how we can enhance the ecological value of the ramparts to pollinators and other wildlife.
